Highlights

UGA hosted approximately 950 Chinese students during the Fall 2016 semester and approximately 400 Chinese scholars between July 2016 and June 2017. China is the leading source of visiting students and scholars coming to the University of Georgia each year as well as the most frequent partner for joint publications.



The UGA College of Public Health partners with the Jiangsu Provincial Center for Disease Control and Prevention and the Shanghai Pudong New Area Centre for Disease Control and Prevention to provide fieldwork opportunities for public health graduate students and to conduct joint public health research.

The University of Georgia is an institutional participant in a new Joint Research Laboratory for Lipid Nutrition and Safety at Jiangnan University, which is intended to facilitate international cooperation in the fields of lipid nutrition, lipid safety, oil processing, and biotechnology.

Freeman Asia Foundation Internship Support Grant

Since Fall 2015, the Freeman Asia Foundation has awarded UGA \$400,000 to fund internships for students working in Asia. Since the grant's inception, awards of at least \$2,500 were made to 145 UGA students for internships in Asian countries, including China, as part of the Asia-Georgia Internship Connection (AGIC).

Joint Publication Data

Between 2007 and 2017, UGA faculty collaborated with colleagues in China to jointly publish 2,182 scholarly articles. Top areas of cooperation during this period included: Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Physical Chemistry, Plant Sciences, and Biotechnology and Applied Microbiology. Top collaborating institutions in China during this period included Northwestern Polytechnical University, Beijing Institute of Technology, Jilin University, Tongji University, and Nanjing Agricultural University.
