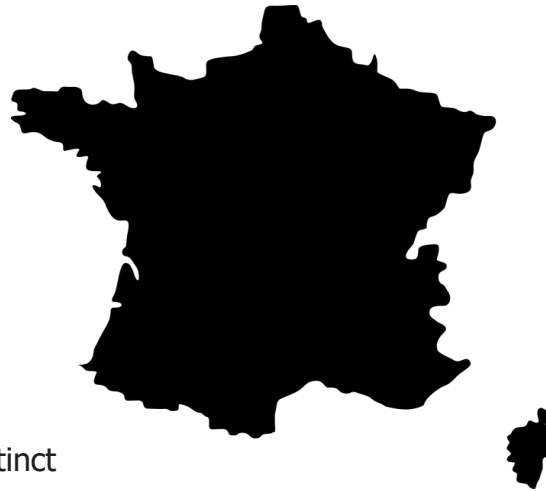




France



Highlights

France has consistently been one of the top destinations for UGA study abroad, with 287 students visiting in the 2016-2017 academic year, through seven distinct study abroad and five exchange programs.

France is a critical partner for joint academic output, with the main areas of co-publication including Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Genetics and Heredity, and Ecology.

UGA faculty and students have been working with Université Toulouse-Jean Jaurès to explore long-term human-environmental dynamics in mountain settings.

The student exchange with Université Jean Moulin Lyon III is both the oldest and most popular student exchange at the University of Georgia.

Joint Publication Data

During 2007-2017, UGA faculty collaborated with colleagues in France to jointly publish 590 scholarly articles. Top areas of cooperation during this period included: Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Genetics and Heredity, and Ecology. Top collaborating institutions in France during this period included the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique, Institut National de la Recherche Agronomique, Sorbonne Universities, Université Paris Saclay, and Languedoc-Roussillon Universities.

Université de Toulouse-Jean Jaurès Partnership

UGA's Department of Anthropology has been working with Université de Toulouse to study long-term human-environmental dynamics in mountain settings. Funding from the IDEX "Attractivity Chairs 2013" program has helped facilitate faculty and graduate mobility.

Université Jean Moulin Lyon III Partnership

UGA's longest running student exchange with Lyon III is also its most popular. Lyon is the second largest metropolitan area in France, while the surrounding area of Rhône-Alpes is the sixth largest economic region in Europe. UGA graduates who have participated in this exchange have gone on to achieve significant accomplishments, some in international fields.

Instituts Nationaux Polytechniques-Ecole Nationale Supérieure Agronomique de Toulouse (INP-ENSAT) Partnership

In addition to student exchange, INP-ENSAT hosts a UGA CAES study abroad program in France that provides students with experience in first-hand food production and environmental stewardship, French language and culture, and European agriculture.

ENGEEES Partnership

UGA's faculty in Marine Sciences have hosted students from the École nationale du génie de l'eau et de l'environnement de Strasbourg (ENGEEES) for internships.

Department of Romance Languages

UGA's Department of Romance Language offers over seventy French-related courses, including courses in French language, literature, and culture. Students can earn a Ph.D., B.A. and minor in French, as well an M.A. in both French Linguistics and French Literature.
