Highlights



Turkey sent the 5th most international students to UGA in Fall 2016 and ranked 8th in terms of visiting international scholars from July 2016 to June 2017.

UGA's partnership with Istanbul Technical University in Turkey involves both a collaborative Bachelor's/Master's degree in Landscape Architecture and joint faculty research projects, particularly in Geology. This research focuses on mineralogy, petrology, hydrology, and geochemistry and is funded by both Turkish and European entities.

UGA Education Abroad in Israel and Turkey

During the 2016-2017 academic year, 4 UGA students studied in Israel, while 2 studied in Turkey.

Academic Collaboration and Exchange in Israel and Turkey

Between 2007 and 2017, UGA faculty collaborated with colleagues in Israel and Turkey to jointly publish 141 and 109 scholarly articles, respectively. Top areas of cooperation during this period included Biochemistry and Molecular Biology and Plant Sciences in Israel, and Physical Chemistry and Atomic, Molecular, and Chemical Physics in Turkey. Top collaborating institutions in Israel during this period included the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Ben Gurion University, Tel Aviv University, and the Weizmann Institute of Science, while in Turkey top collaborating institutions were Middle East Technical University, and Istanbul Technical University.

Partnerships in Israel

University of Haifa

The University of Haifa is a valuable partner institution for both UGA's Center for Global Health and its Department of Religion. UGA students seeking a Graduate Certificate in Global Health may complete an internship at the University of Haifa, while joint research educational programs are potential opportunities for students and faculty in UGA's Department of Religion.

Partnerships in Turkey

Istanbul Technical University

UGA's College of Environment and Design and Istanbul Technical University have developed a collaborative Bachelor's/Master's degree program in Landscape Architecture. Through this program, students complete three years of study at Istanbul Technical University followed by two at UGA. They earn a Bachelor's degree from Istanbul Technical University and a Master's degree from UGA. Additionally, faculty members in UGA's Department of Geology collaborate with Istanbul Technical University faculty to carry out critical geological research in the fields of mineralogy, petrology, hydrogeology, and geochemistry. Funding for these research ventures is provided by Turkish and European entities, including TÜBİTAK (the Scientific and Technological Research Council of Turkey), YÖK (the Turkish Council of Higher Education), and Erasmus.

Duzce University

Duzce University plays an important role in the modernization of Turkish forestry. Faculty from the Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources at UGA and Duzce University carry out collaborative research that focuses on Turkish and Mediterranean forestry and culture, applied forest planning, and forest management.

Middle East Technical University

This partnership supports collaborative research and educational activities among scientists in UGA's Department of Geology and Middle East Technical University's Department of Geological Engineering. There is funding for staff and student mobility from the Erasmus+ Program.

Sabanci University

This partnership offers joint research opportunities associated with graduate student mobility. Sabanci University provides access to funding in order to increase graduate student mobility among doctoral students.
